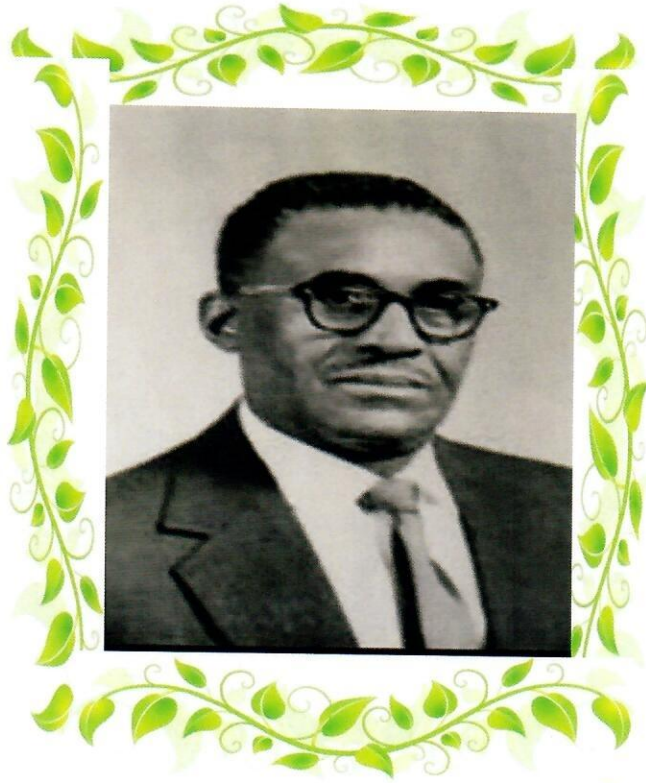

KIMBROUGH FAMILY BEGINNINGS

The Kimbro surname, whose spelling changed quite frequently, depended on who recorded it. The Kimbro/Kimbrough families of European extraction came to Tennessee from North Carolina and Virginia. These families were very large and settled in Kentucky, Alabama, Georgia and Tennessee. The African-American Kimbrough family that settled in Marshall County, MS around Hudsonville began its history nestled in the center of Middle Tennessee, where Rutherford County lies, with Murfreesboro as its largest city.

In 1870 a young fourteen year old black male named Enoch Kimbro is found in the federal census, recorded on June 20th, living in District 10 with Murfreesboro as the post office. According to the maps from that era the location was in southwest Rutherford County which bordered on Bedford County. The households of the Kimbro families were listed rather oddly, house number 117 was recorded with Caroline a forty-five year old black female listed as head and born in Virginia. She was listed along with one male Edmond 18 years old. This information was located at the end of the page, on the next page the household is numbered as 118. This household had Angeline a 17 year old black female listed at the top with Henry 16, Enoch 14, Reddick 12, Clinnon 10, William 5 and Eliza 2 all born in Tennessee. The exact relationship of Enoch and the others is not etched in stone. Speculatively, Caroline is either Enoch's grandmother or mother and Angeline possibly his sister.

As a point of interest, in Bedford County, Tennessee, just across the line from where Enoch resided in 1870 was a family of European parentage headed by Riley Kimbro with brothers named William and Fredrick. There is a similarity of family names to Enoch's family. I believe Reddick listed with Angeline was actually Fredrick.

There is no evidence to how or when Enoch Kimbro arrived in Marshall County, MS. The marriage records for the county show him preparing to marry Malindy (Malinda) Dowdy on January 10th, 1878 with his surname appearing as Kimber. Marshall County Mississippi's 1880 Federal Census shows Enoch with his wife Malinda and the surname of Kimbrough recorded. However, this census is very confusing. The dwelling number is 135 with two family numbers 162 Henry Kimbrough and his daughter Granada and Clinton Kimbrough family number 163 (same dwelling) with wife Malinda, son Elijah, daughter Rena, and cousin Enic (Enoch). Quite twisted and needed unraveling. Enoch appears in the 1900 Federal Census of Marshall County, MS with the name spelled as Kimmons. The household lists Malinda his wife of 22 years and mother of 12, with only 10 living in 1900. The children were Elijah, Riley, David, Sarah, Enoch, Jimmie, Hattie, Hillery and Henrietta.

From this point on you can go forward by following the descendants of Riley who married Annie Lyles and fathered Earl, Robert, Hannah, Melinda, Tiney, Annie B., Riley, Estella, Dallas, Polly, and Roy. This information was researched and compiled by Teresa Hill Mays.

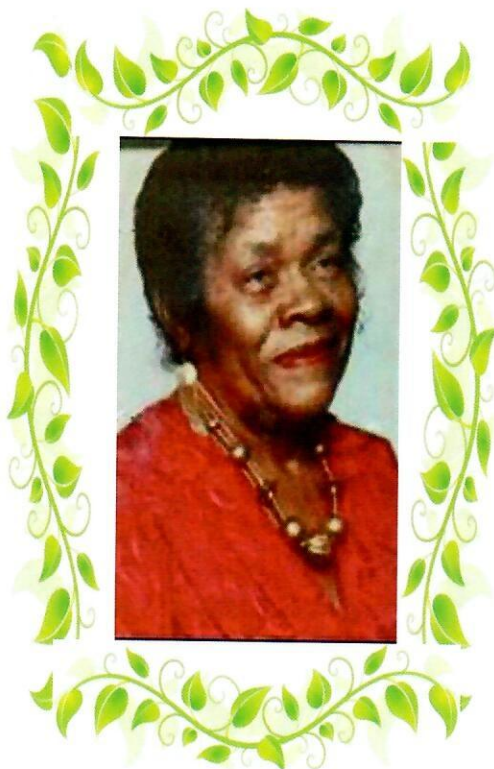
